

own good – if that were necessary – and bestow it on his offspring? The question answers itself, yet if we look around us, we see that some people have health and happiness and no prosperity, others enjoy happiness but lack both health and prosperity and yet others, have prosperity and lead miserable lives bereft of physical wellbeing and emotional satisfaction. Why does this happen? Who, or what, is withholding their good? God, we learn, is Love, and is impersonal and unbiased respecting the filling full of His Presence in the lives of all mankind, so where does lack arise?

For a long time, the eternal 'why' puzzled and worried me. Why should one be greatly blessed while another received nothing, and if the individual's existence here on earth was the beginning of his life, why did some possess so many good things and others lack the bare necessities that keep body and soul together? Does God who works strictly according to natural – not supernatural – law, decide these issues? Surely if he did, far from being impartial (as he undoubtedly is) he would be guilty of the grossest unfairness and favouritism. This, of course, is not so, and the explanation is that all of us here on earth are travellers on a journey. We have come from somewhere and when we shed our present bodies we shall go on into a new environment; the place of abode in which we now exist represents only one little station on route.

Think for a moment of a circular trip starting at Cape Town. We come by ship to Durban where we fly to the rand, in Johannesburg we entrain for Kimberly and so proceed back to the peninsula. It has been a journey during which we have not been permitted to miss out a single place, nor to double back on our tracks. Before embarking on the trip we heard from others who had made it already; a lot about climatic conditions, the kinds of people we should meet, the landscape we should traverse and the various coastal settlements we should sight as our ship steamed past them.

All these things we should have heard about but we should have no personal knowledge of them. Most people can imagine what it is like in Canada when the thermometer drops 20° below freezing, or the conditions that obtain in Durban when the humidity in the air has almost reached saturation point, but they cannot know these unless they have been in the places where they occur, so to experience them they have to visit the countries concerned.

So it is with the man on the round trip, he starts out from Cape Town a raw and unenlightened traveller, compelled to make that particular circuit which may take him a week, a month, a year or 100 years, and at every stopping place he learns by experience what each one has to offer. The same holds good for our life journeys out from God and back to him. We come from the higher realms of Spirit – imperfect or ignorant souls; countless numbers have preceded us on our one way voyage and they have already gone through what now befalls us, other innumerable millions are behind us. They have yet to learn of that with which we, who here on earth are in the most condensed state of consciousness in which the soul functions, are becoming increasingly familiar.

As we look around us on our present plane of awareness we recognise in some measure, what the souls indwelling the bodies we encounter have created for themselves in aeons past, for what has been sown must also be reaped.

"Behold, I send my messenger before me to prepare my way" applies to every man both here and elsewhere. Before the individual takes up his abode on any sphere, the experience that his soul within him, *and no one else*, has already selected and passed through, form his environment, conditions, equipment and assets in his new home, and what will be his loss in the next state of consciousness he is now preparing for himself.

From inexperience to knowledge, from unconsciousness to self consciousness, from ignorance to complete awareness we make the pilgrimage, learning from those who have gone ahead, leaving behind us for those who follow the answers we have found in the course of overcoming our own difficulties. Life as God-individualised-in-man has to experience everything in the universe for Its purpose is eventually to know Itself completely, and this It cannot do if It has missed the growth and unfoldment that come only through experience.

Can you understand what I am trying to explain to you, why some of you are poor, some unhappy and others poverty stricken? GOD IS NOT AT FAULT; He, as Life or Intelligence, actually constitutes you and is, as Love, the sum-total of Power, Knowledge and Perfection housed within your bodies, and as you find the consciousness of this indwelling Charity so does it seep through the entire being, like a tiny glimmer of light that, through a crack in the wall, steals into a darkened room. We are these murky chambers and are able to open up the cracks which, as they get wider and wider, admit ever more light, until ultimately its luminosity disperses all the darkness and dissipates all the negation that has been clouding and cluttering up our individual lives.

We all tend to put the blame upon others when we are poor, sick or unhappy, but persons have nothing to do with the conditions that obtain for us. These take their rise in the states of consciousness that we have, or have not, evolved for ourselves. There is no one, no thing, no power or principality that can interpose between us and our God-consciousness; none that can obstruct our good or saddle us with evil. We alone can promote or demote ourselves as we release or withhold the awareness of Power. Nine out of ten persons imprison It because they find it so extremely difficult to practise the simple Law of Love. To love means being practical, a realist and by loving we shall call down untold blessings upon our own heads. To obtain the good we want, we must give of it to others, must see good in them, be prepared continually to forgive them, so bringing our hearts and minds into accord with this universal Presence of Love. The Christ overcame all things through non-resistance and the application of love, and today He has countless millions of followers. His teaching, "Give, and it shall be given unto you" has endured through the years. Give of your time, your money, your talents and particularly of your love for, unless your hearts go out with your hands, there is nothing to it; the gift without the giver is empty and vain.

All you can ever owe to any man is love which brings you into at-one-ment with Power, Beauty, Knowledge, Protection and Perfection and puts you into tune with all the spiritual ideas necessary to your well-being, success and prosperity.

Truth is eternal, none can destroy It, and when anybody has, as the result of prayer, had personal demonstrations over poverty, loss and unhappiness he cannot be shaken regarding the verity of what he has learned.

Day by day we all record in our minds and hearts our consciousness of either good or evil, and we see these qualities expressed in our physical bodies and in our material affairs. So, if anyone wishes to rid himself of certain conditions or to be freed from fear, let him fill his heart with love, which casts out all anxiety, worry, and turmoil and will give him peace.

I cannot be afraid of you, or you of me, if we love one another, for Love, as God, is a fulfilment of the Law, and faith in God sets It free. Nevertheless, is it not according to our faith that it is done unto us? It is our complete inner at-one-ment with, and acceptance of, the Bounty that is God. While Love puts us in rapport with Deity and His manifestations – our fellow men the world over – It must be allied to faith for All-good to be set free through us and to us. Whatever we perceive in our lives today, is a reflection of the messengers we have sent before us. Here in this material world, we see to some degree what we have put into life and thought into consciousness; so, if there are conditions that we would eliminate, such as poverty, disease or unhappiness, we know what we have to do. We have to change our way of thinking about them, to make a complete volte face and start living in the awareness of the thing we desire. The promise "All things whatsoever you desire" still stands. We must check our minds and hearts, discarding the weaknesses and strengthening the virtues, for only then can we hold out the Cup of Life which shall, for every human being, ultimately be filled in a measure to share and to spare.

But we alone can present It, and whether it be a thimble, a bucket, a tank or a reservoir, God, Who is Love, Beauty, Happiness, Peace and Harmony, will fill It with His Substance, everything our hearts can long for will be liberated by our faith. For it is faith that sustains us through all the ills that flesh is heir to and ultimately inspires us to stretch out our hands to God so that he can fill them full with His Living Substance. Love fulfils the Can Common fallacy among many

students of Truth is the belief that faith is the chief attribute we should strive to cultivate. While there is little doubt that faith in its highest form is indeed a quality beyond price, it would be wise for us to look at this belief in the light of the highest concepts of Truth and see whether faith in itself is the greatest of the divine attributes.

In a previous article I gave the illustration of a man who possessed, according to ordinary human standards, a remarkably high degree of faith. Through demonstrating his faith in a practical way, he was able to inspire others to go and do likewise. He proved a real channel of blessing to them. Yet, in the final analysis, he lacked love in its true sense – that love which we are told is the fulfilment of the law. His faith had achieved for him success and prosperity out of failure and poverty, but in the attainment of these things he had lost humility. He had given too much importance to the material results of his faith, and in consequence, while his personality seemed to expand – there are many of us who are often overawed by ostentatiousness – his individuality receded into the background. Now we find that, while the material baubles are his, he has not serenity and peace of mind. He is constantly striving for something which only the quality of *love which fulfils the law* can give.

Writers on Truth subjects make frequent use of the word 'love' and very few of us seem to realise what is meant by it. More often than not we visualise that type of love which manifests itself between men and women, parent and child, and so on. But this is only one small facet of the great diamond of love in its universal sense. The ordinary kind of love that we experience in our mundane affairs, whilst admirable, is not the love to which the teaching of Truth refers. And it is because we think of love in its very limited form, that we cannot agree that "love fulfils the law."

Often, I have had the query put to me that if love does indeed fulfil the law of our good, why do certain individuals, who are "living examples of love," fail to manifest health or happiness or prosperity? Why is there incompleteness in their lives? And when I have asked for a definition of love as used in the biblical quotation, it has always fallen far short of the Truth concept. Usually, I am told that so-and-so is a loving father, or a devoted wife, or "he is very good to his friends," or "the poor worship them." These are limited manifestations of universal love, but is one ray of the sun, the sun? Does being a loving father, a devoted wife, good to one's friends, or charitable to the poor, imply that state of uplifted consciousness which is universal love? No, it does not, but it is a step in the right direction and from these little expressions of love, the greater love can be developed; but in themselves they do not *fulfil* the law. We have only to look to ourselves to realise that, while we may be practising these things, our love is very limited and often obscured by resentment and intolerance, and fear of much that we do not harmonise with, or that we do not understand.

Universal love is completely *unconditional*. It is the only form of love that casts out fear of all things –for can one fear that which one loves with an understanding love? It is that elevated state of consciousness which, regardless of circumstances or appearances, constantly flows out as a benediction. It recognises the absolute indivisibility of God and His creation and identifies itself with all things, seen and unseen, knowing them to be part of itself. It cannot be harmed, it cannot be deprived of good; for it is the fundamental power of the universe in action, drawing to itself that which it gives of itself.

In the East are certain highly evolved souls who have touched the fringes of this love. For long periods at a time, they go into the jungles to meditate and pray. As you know, much damage and loss of life is caused by wild denizens of these places and frequently the government is compelled to take preventative action. Yet these people spend their time there as safely as we would in the home of friends. Not only are they not harmed by the animals and reptiles, but great friendship exists between them. There is a complete understanding and the state of peace prevails.

Now with the Bhakti, or Disciples of Love, as these individuals are called, it is not a case purely of faith that they will not be harmed, neither do they make the conscious effort to apply their faith. As far as they are concerned, the whole matter resolves itself into one word – love. The fact that they should be afraid – at least from the ordinary viewpoint – does not enter their consciousness. It is a psychological impossibility to fear that which one loves; and they have cultivated that divine love for all things manifest and unmanifest. These men have made an integral part of themselves the truth that God and His creation are ONE, although it is unity in diversity. God is love, they are conscious of that love; therefore, in their life, harmony and peace must rule.

We, as onlookers, would probably say that they have great faith – and they have – but their love is so all-absorbing that faith is but an incidental aspect of it, just as wisdom, understanding and peace are different aspects. They are all contained in the one great whole – divine love. And the facet that shines most brightly in this diamond is humility – humility which is grateful for God and His manifestation, and thankful for the opportunity to share His love in its many forms, with the world around.

Sometimes we, in our own consciousness, experience that sublime elevation of spirit where we love everybody and everything. The world becomes to us a place of beauty and contentment and we feel that all created things are part of us; that "God's in His heaven and all's right with the world." It is at such moments that we get glimpses of universal love and of the power of dominion over circumstances that it brings. This is but the dawning in consciousness of that love which one day we shall attain. We come to realise that all the little efforts we have made to give of the love we have, are contributing towards the building of that supreme structure that shall be, not merely in our consciousness, but shall *be* our consciousness – love universal.

At our present stage of spiritual growth, in order to demonstrate over conditions of lack, it is necessary for us to apply the limited form of love with what face we can muster. The one has to act as a support to the other. The more sincere the application, the greater the demonstration. Faith by itself can produce much, but without love as its motivating force it cannot give completeness in one's life. One or the other of the divine blessings will remain unmanifest in visible form. We have but to study our own lives and the lives of those about us to see the truth of this.

The consciousness of the love that fulfils the law does not come without effort, but each day is a new opportunity to cultivate it. Let us widen our horizons and rid ourselves of all those pettinesses that include this one and exclude that, that like this but detest that. Of all those personal, political, racial and religious prejudices that putrefy our lives, let us purify ourselves of them. If our brother will not be reconciled to us, let us leave him to the law which love fulfils. More than this we cannot do. The greater the scope of our love, the less we have to fear – this is a logical conclusion.

Whether it is health, or happiness, or supply you need, go right ahead and love yourself into these things. Know that everything concerning them is a part of yourself because it is a part of universal Spirit. Love yourself into your good and your good will love itself into you. These are not meant to be nice-sounding phrases, the sugar-coating around the pill, as it were – they are the truth that has been demonstrated countless times in things big and small.

If you find, as most of us do, that it is not possible to give love to anyone or anything that is not personal to you, just try giving goodwill. This we can all do; and goodwill towards all things, even when we cannot understand them, is the first sign of a developing universal consciousness. How often have we not misjudged people or things simply because we have failed to understand them and because they have conflicted with what WE thought was right? How many times have we not discovered that our judgments were wrong? And even if the behaviour of these people or things does conflict with the standards of Truth as we know them, can we by our destructive criticism and condemnation or physical violence, draw them into the realm of Truth? We know that we cannot for our behaviour is in itself a travesty of Truth. It is tinged with Pharisaism. But in willing good for them they become impregnated with the subtle but powerful influence of Spirit, which in the end must express constructively through them for their and our own good.

This is the only way – there is no other – to freedom from fear, hatred, misery and lack, and the many other ills by which we are punishing ourselves. In identifying ourselves in consciousness with the seen and unseen good of the universe, we destroy the mental separation we have, in our ignorance, built up and which is the cause of incompleteness in our lives. Where there is goodwill and ultimately unconditional love, there can be no separation and no lack spiritually, mentally or materially. Love casts out all fear for in love there is fulfilment. Love brings unity, love is utility – and God is love.

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t is usually fairly easy for a Truth student who has gone a little distance in Truth to demonstrate health, because most people feel that health is their right; they are entitled to health anyway, and by having it they are not depriving anybody else. So, it is simple for them to believe in the possibility of God's restoring them to health, than if they were trying to demonstrate supply. Because as soon as it comes to supply, they know very well that it will only come to them through the medium of some human channel. Supply does not rain down out of heaven in the form of sacks full of hundred rand notes, it comes usually as a result of some service rendered. Then, when they are in need, they remember that, and find it very difficult to believe that they already receive, especially, if the need is such that they are presently burdened with a load of debt and cannot pay, and the position gets more urgent and they more worried. It seems an almost impossible situation. Yet the promise of the Christ was emphatic: "Whatsoever things ye pray and ask for, believe that ve receive them, and ve shall have them".

The principles governing supply are the same as those relating to health or any other blessing; there is no difference. Whatever supply you now have has come from God, even although it may seem to be inadequate, and you may need more. What you have has come from God. But if you need more, you have to believe you receive it. Here is where you may make the initial mistake. You have, let us say, a thousand rand and you need two thousand. You look at this pile of bills and wonder what on earth you are going to do about the missing thousand. The need is pressing, people have trusted you and you must be worthy of their trust and pay them, but how? How are you to pay out two thousand rand when you only have one thousand? So, your mind runs always on the missing thousand, and as long as your mind is on what you lack, how can you possibly expect to believe that you receive?

But supposing that instead of that, you get your mind on the thousand that you have and realise that it came from God. Then begin to be grateful, if only for the reason that if you had not got it, how much worse off would you be. So, you are grateful for the little that you have even if it is not enough. You can be grateful for it if you stop and think. There are all sorts of circumstances raising side issues. Sometimes men are in positions where they have fixed salaries, fixed incomes, and they have employers who are not very sympathetic, some not even very human, and they look at their situation and think to themselves that there is no possibility of earning any more, because they are fixed in one job and they cannot leave it; they cannot get another job, especially at their age, they just have to put up with it, and there is no way in which they can expect to get more supply. To think like that, is doing the exact opposite of what the Christ advised us to do. You have to find a way of believing you already receive. And the first need is to be grateful for what you have and to get your mind on that; to realise that it has come from God, no matter whom it has come through. It may have come through some employer or some investment, but it has come *from* God. The channel is neither here nor there. Begin by being grateful for what you have.

Then begin to realise that the same Father Who gave that original thousand rand, is well able and willing to give another thousand rand. On the authority of the Christ, we can say He is able and willing. If we are Truth students, we must elect to believe what he taught, even although we cannot yet see how it could possibly work out. Then we realise that God is not restricted in the channels that He can use. He can open up ways that we never dreamed of. He can bring supply to you, either through the channels He is already using, or some entirely new channel that you never heard of and never dreamed of. What channel He uses, when He uses it, how he uses it are things that you need not concern yourself with at all, they are not your business. Your part is to centre your attention wholly upon God as your supply.

On the authority of the Christ, you can believe that the Kingdom of God is *within you*, and where else would you expect to find God but in His Kingdom? Well then, the Kingdom of God within you means God *within you*, or as Paul says, "the Holy Spirit within you," what Jesus calls "The Father within" and Paul calls "the Christ." If you are in some job where your income is fixed and limited and not likely to be increased, that does not worry

you. You are now dealing with the Spirit of the Creator Who made the whole universe. He is within you, the Life in your body, and you are satisfied to know that He knows just how to answer your prayers. But because He has promised and because you believe, you can begin at once to thank Him that it is already done. "Thank You, Father, I know that Your abundant supply flows into my experience NOW," and thoughts of that kind.

A widow once went to the prophet Elisha because her sons were about to be taken into slavery, in payment of her debts. She had nobody to turn to, no old age pension, nothing of that kind. So, she did the only thing she could do, she went to the Man of God. That may be what you do. You have nobody to whom you can turn. You may have relatives and friends who would help you if they could, but they may be in the same position as you so they cannot help. For one reason or another, you are obliged to go to God. The first question the prophet asked her was, "What have you in the house?" He did not say, "How much are you short of, and what do your debts amount to, who are your creditors?" He did not discuss that at all. His query was, "What assets have you got; what have you in the house?"

Now here is a lesson for us. Is our attention on what we have, what we can see, or is it on what we *have not got*? So let us get our attention on to what we have, what we can see. The widow said, "I have a little oil, perhaps an ounce or two", and that stood between her and starvation. The prophet said to her, "Go and borrow empty vessels, not a few". And she might very well have replied, as we might, "What for? What am I going to borrow money sacks for, what is the good of going to the bank to get a new cheque book?" But she did not, she made no objections but did precisely what she was told; she went out to borrow empty vessels as her act of faith. She took the risk of neighbours saying to her, "What do you think you are playing at, borrowing empty vessels and bringing back empty vessels?" She took that risk because that was what the prophet said.

How much are we prepared to demonstrate our faith as the widow did? Let us pause and ask ourselves that. Have we anything like her faith? Anyway, she went and borrowed these vessels then the Prophet said "Now begin to pour the oil". And then, as you know, the widow went on pouring and pouring some invisible supply until all the vessels were filled, and there were no more. Then Elisha said, "Now go and sell the oil, pay your debts, and live on the remainder". He might just well as well have given her money, but he did not; he wanted her to use the pitifully small resources that she had: he wanted her to demonstrate her faith. She did not say, "What is the use of pouring two ounces of oil out of this bottle into those vessels? It won't even fill the bottom of one of those bottles". No, she did not hesitate, but just began to pour. Again, have we anything like that widow's faith? We are not dealing with oil, and the circumstances are not in detail the same for us, but the principle is the same, and it is the principle that is important.

When people come to us for advice, and they are in the position that they have a thousand rand and need two thousand,

we say to them, "Now swallow your pride, and go to each of those creditors and pay him half of what you owe him, and then tell him that you will pay him the remainder very shortly, but you are paying him this now in order to show your good faith." You may not like it; it is not a very nice thing to have to do, to go to the grocer and say, "I owe you two hundred rand, and I can only pay you one hundred." It hurts your pride, but that is what you have to do. You have some resources, and they are resources given to you by God, and He is using those resources through you; it is God paying through you, even though He is paying only half the account. But the fact that He is paying only half is nothing to do with you; you are His agent, so you release that amount of money, and with blessing give it to the creditor. You are not drawing from your limited resources, you are drawing from the inexhaustible resources of God; He is paying through you, remember that. You are not paying anything to anybody – God is paying through you to the creditors. Try to grasp that and centre your attention on what you have and pay gladly; be glad that you have got that to pay and are not in a position where you cannot pay anything at all, which would be so much worse.

We are dealing all the time with the Spirit of the Creator Who can as easily create a couple of hundred gallons of oil as a couple of ounces. What difference does it make to Him? But we have to grasp Whom it is we are dealing with; not the creditor, not ourselves, not our employer, not the channels that we normally expect our supply to come through, but the *Spirit of the living* *Christ within us*. Then we can believe we receive; we can believe we have already received – the Spirit lacks nothing. And the Spirit within us is Infinite Supply. It will pour Itself through us and into our affairs to the degree that is necessary for our needs; not for our wants – that may be something very different but for our needs.

The stories in the Bible illustrate to us in the clearest possible language the principles which are at work in our lives. So, it does not make any difference whatsoever, whether you can see no way at all by which God can increase your supply. Whether you can see it or not has nothing to do with the case. You cannot see five seconds into the future – God can see all the way. If it is necessary for your relief to come from San Francisco or Tokyo or Melbourne, what is that to you? It might come from there – from your nextdoor neighbour, or from somebody within your own household.

Once we can grasp these fundamental principles and work by them, really believe them, we shall find they are as valid for us as they were for the people of long ago; otherwise, what was the point of the Masters teaching? He taught us these things; He told us that it was the power of the Father working through Him that healed the sick and raised the dead and gave sight to the blind and so on. And that same power working through Him, gave the disciples all their fish; working through Elisha multiplied the widow's oil; through Moses brought manna down from heaven and water out of the rock. All these stories are intended to bolster up our faith, and experiences through which we pass are intended to give us the opportunity to use the little faith we already have.

What is the use of telling ourselves that we have faith if we never use it? So, these experiences come to us, to give us an opportunity to prove that faith, and by proving it, to go a step higher on the spiritual ladder. They are NOT evil in themselves; they are not designed by a God Who wants to bring some evil into our lives. God does not strike us down with poverty or sickness; God is of too pure eyes to behold iniquity; God is Light, and Light has never seen the darkness, because wherever Light is there cannot be any darkness. And if we begin at once to realise, even faintly, the presence of God within us and then surrender utterly to His will and let His will be done, only good - in whatever form we need it - can possibly come to us. If we acquaint ourselves now with this great principle of the indwelling Spirit of God within us, capable and willing to do for us what he did for those people of long ago, we shall find it easier to believe that, in spite of the fact that all we can see is a sheaf of bills and only half the amount of money to pay for them, or a guarter or a tenth or whatever it may be, the law of God is at work, for no other reason than that we dare to trust and have courage to hold on in spite of the appearance.

That is the invitation that comes to us from the Scripture, and if we will take the trouble to learn about the indwelling Spirit of Christ, we shall realise what St. Paul meant when he said, "The Spirit beareth witness with our spirit that we are the children of God, and if children then heirs."





he story of the prodigal son is one of the most quoted of the biblical

stories and probably more sermons have been based upon it than upon any other of the parables; but how seldom one hears an exposition of it that does other than hold up the prodigal as a horrible example.

Properly considered, the story has much more to tell us than that. Its characters are a father and two sons, but more often than not, in sermons and writings, the second son is passed over as being of very little importance. He is pictured as a somewhat selfish being who is annoyed and resentful because he has not been so favourably treated as was his brother. In fact, he is used as a sort of foil to the main character in the story – the prodigal.

Let us examine the whole story in detail and see what we can get from it that will be valuable to us. Which is, that it is not merely a story told as a warning to us not to be prodigals but is a picture of God as the Father; humanity as the sons, and of the relationship between them. If we can accept this explanation of it, it becomes apparent that there are several misconceptions about God that will have to be discarded.

We hear much about how greatly we can disappoint God by our behaviour, and how sorrowful He can become on account of our ignorance and wilfulness. We are also told of His anger, caused by our sins, and the dire punishments that He will mete out to us in due course; but a study of the characteristics of the Father in the story fails to reveal these things. We are taught that it is possible for God – if He so chooses – to interfere in our lives and force us to undergo this, that, or the other experience. The story does not reflect this either. When the son who is to prove himself to be the "prodigal" announces his intention of going forth into the world to make his own life for himself, we do not find that the father sternly forbids such a course, neither does he in any way use his power to prevent it. Here we must remember that, for the sake of simplicity, the Master used human characters to illustrate the point of His story, thus the Father is a picturisation of God, who is Omniscience. He must have known then exactly what the experience of the son would be. He knew just how adverse the conditions would be; he knew that the son would suffer as a result of his self-made adversities, but he made no move to prevent them. Why not? Because he also knew that by means of these experiences the son would grow in knowledge, and that at the end of them he would inevitably return to his Father.

Does the story in any way show that these experiences, undergone by the son as a result of his own wrong thinking ("sinning" if you prefer the term), were in any way hurtful to the Father? Does it give you the impression that the Father was only waiting until the son came home again in order to heap pains and penalties upon him? Definitely not. On the contrary, the Father waited until the son came home in order to heap a multiplicity of good things upon him. Had the Father anything to forgive? Since the son had hurt only himself, and not his Father, there was nothing for the Father to forgive, but very much for him to "give-for". Rich in hard-won experience, having a very clear knowledge of the relative value of good and evil, the son had returned equipped to appreciate and use the treasures of his Father's house. And the Father, knowing this, freely gave them to him.

In this parable the master sought to show his hearers how God, whom he called "our Father," really deals with us, his children. Surely of all people, he is the best qualified to give us the real picture, and yet it is his own followers who have set up a picture that is very different from his. In his picture, do we find the God of anger, jealousy, and dire punishment? Such a Father is not reflected at all; what is reflective is love – love to the uttermost. And consequently, the story is in line with all his teachings.

And what of the other son? He also has a great lesson to teach the student of truth. Great stress has been placed on his very human reactions to the conditions surrounding the reception of his brother. Many people, who would act and frequently do act, in exactly the same way, are quite sure that they can see where *he* was wrong. The workers in this school are frequently made aware of this from such statements as: "I so often see the pages of letters published in your magazine of answers to prayers that students have received, but God does not seem to answer mine. I cannot demonstrate the good that I so badly need."? Is this not exactly the attitude of the second son in the parable? Does this question not imply a certain amount of doubt as to the fairness of God's dealings, and does it not contain an element of envy and disappointment? The answer to it is contained in the story in the reply of the Father to the complaint of the son: "Son, thou art always with me and all that I have IS thine."

This answer throws the onus of failure on to the son, and we can easily extend it in our own words, somewhat like this: "Son, why blame me for your lack? What you really lack is understanding and faith. All that I have is already yours, but you have not believed it. You have entertained doubts and fears and so have not been able to take that which is already yours. You have feared that perhaps I had not enough; you have feared that perhaps I may not have wanted to let you have all the good things you need. You have not understood our real relationship and have thought that it was necessary for you to approach me in fear and trembling seeking to be given that which I already bestowed. Freely and lovingly have I given to you all that I have, but the gift cannot benefit you until you accept it. Your brother chose the hard road of bitter experience, whilst you chose to stay at home. Both are roads upon which understanding can be gained; why complain because he has reached that understanding and reaped its reward before you? Is it not his success that has led you to seek the cause of your own failure?"

This parable of the Father and his sons contains great truths, wonderful teachings; and one of the most important of those teachings is again brought out in the instructions of the Master that we should pray believing that we *have it* and it *shall* be given unto us.

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
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
